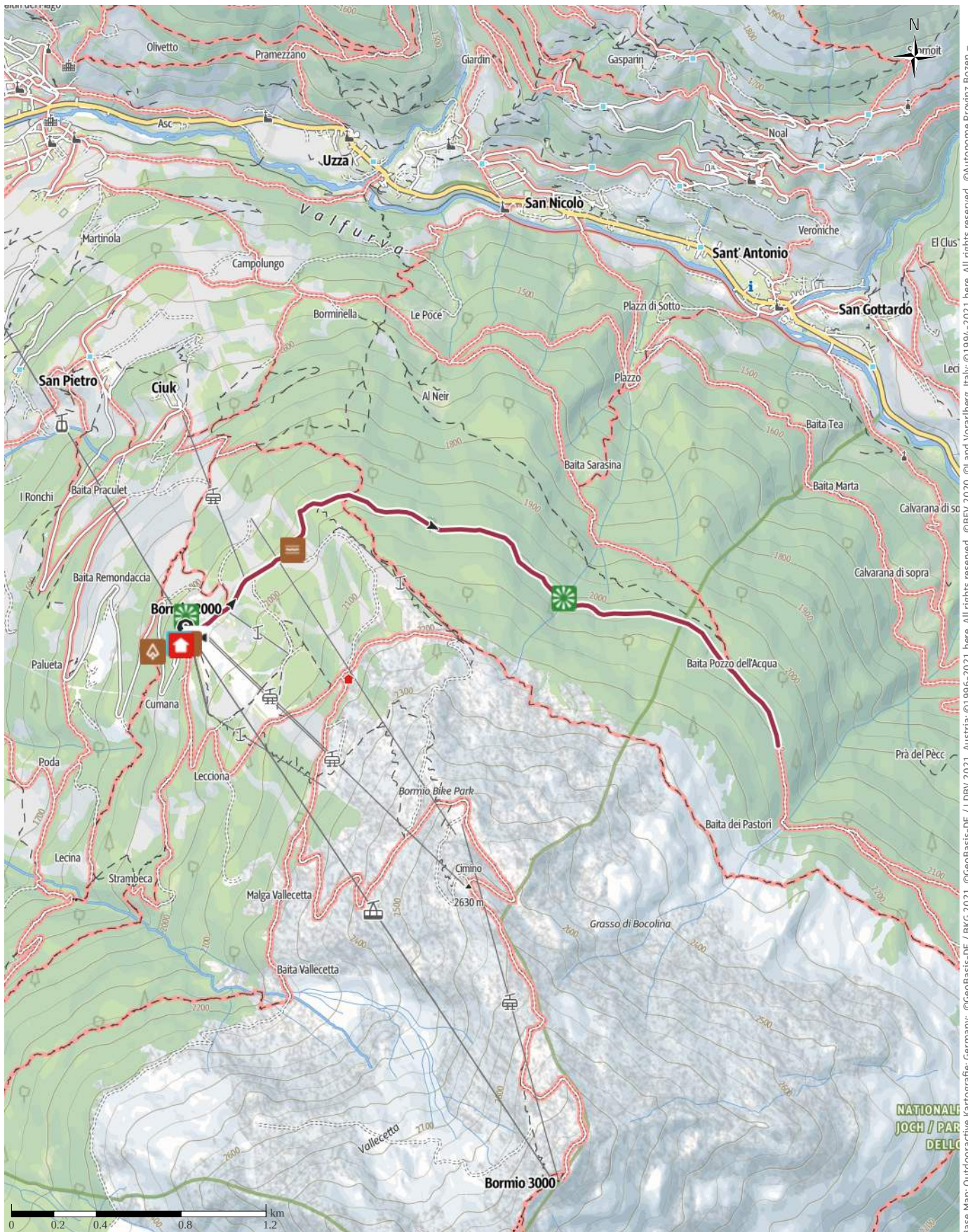

A family-friendly walk in Bormio 2000, through forests, nature, and art installations inspired by the Alpine environment.

The Path of Purity is an easy family hike that follows the Water Trail through the woods of Bormio 2000. The route, about 4 kilometers round-trip, takes adults and children alike on a journey to discover the value of water, the Alpine landscape, and biodiversity through themed display boards and wooden sculptures created by local artists.

Since you can reach Bormio 2000 via the ski lifts, the

trail is ideal even on the hottest summer days, offering a chance to spend a few hours in the cool, natural surroundings.

The Path of Purity is a themed trail designed to bring families and children closer to nature and the environmental heritage of the Bormio area. The trail begins at Bormio 2000, which is easily accessible from the valley floor via the ski lifts. From there, you follow the so-called "Water Trail," a pleasant path winding through the woods, characterized by gentle slopes and a cool, shaded environment.

Along the way, several thematic display boards explain the role of water in the Alpine ecosystem, the natural cycle of springs, biodiversity, and the delicate balance that connects the land, the forests, and the mountains.

Making the experience even more engaging are the wooden sculptures created by local artists—works that interpret the relationship between water, nature, and the landscape through forms inspired by the Alpine environment.

The trail is approximately 4 kilometers long in total—covering the round trip along the same route—and features an elevation gain of about 170 meters. It does not involve any significant technical difficulties, but still requires appropriate footwear and a basic level of fitness for walking.

The trail is particularly well-suited for families who wish to spend a few hours outdoors, combining physical activity with exploration and observation. The informational panels and installations transform a simple walk through the woods into an educational and enjoyable experience.

Thanks to its elevation and the shade provided by the vegetation, the Path of Purity also offers a great alternative to walks in the valley floor during the hottest days of summer.

The project is carried out with the support of Levissima, in collaboration with the local community and the Stelvio National Park.

Author's recommendation

Take the time to look at the sculptures and read the information on the display boards: the Path of Purity isn't just a walk, but an opportunity to discover, together with your children, just how important water is for life, the landscape, and the mountain environment. On hot days, taking the lifts to Bormio 2000 allows you to quickly leave the valley floor behind and walk in a cooler, shadier setting. Before setting out, it's a good idea to check the

lift operating hours and the time of the last downhill run.

Points of Interest

The Water Trail

A trail nestled in the woods that winds through the natural landscape of Bormio 2000. Its name reflects the presence of water and its fundamental role in shaping the landscape and sustaining alpine ecosystems.

Thematic Information Panels

Along the route, there are informational panels dedicated to the water cycle, biodiversity, mountain environments, and the relationship between natural resources and the local area.

The content is designed to be easy to read and accessible even to families and children.

The Wooden Sculptures

The trail is enriched by works created by local artists, who interpret the themes of water and nature through wood.

The sculptures transform the walk into a small outdoor artistic experience and help children observe the landscape with greater curiosity.

The Forests of Bormio 2000

The trail winds through a cool, shaded environment characterized by conifers, clearings, and views of the surrounding mountains.

The forest offers shelter from the sun, making the walk particularly pleasant during the summer months.

The Alpine Panorama

In the more open sections, you can admire Bormio's mountain landscape and the peaks surrounding the valley.

Bormio 2000

An area easily accessible by ski lifts, serving as the starting point for walks and hikes suitable for various fitness levels.

The availability of amenities and places to eat allows you to combine your hike with a relaxing day at high altitude.

Safety information

The trail does not present any particular technical difficulties, but it is located in a mountainous area. Always check the weather conditions before setting out, and do not undertake the hike in the event of thunderstorms or severe weather.

After rain, some dirt sections may be wet or slippery.

Children must be accompanied and supervised throughout the hike, especially on uphill sections or near any steep slopes, waterways, or work areas.

Do not climb on the sculptures, do not cross any fences, and respect the installations and signs along the route.

During the initial opening phase, minor completion or maintenance work may be necessary: always follow the on-site signage.

Equipment**We recommend:**

hiking boots or athletic shoes with good traction;

layered clothing;

a windbreaker or rain jacket;

water;

a hat and sunscreen;

hiking poles, if needed;

a child carrier backpack for young children who cannot yet walk on their own.

Even on hot days, the weather can change quickly at high altitudes, and temperatures can drop.

Tips and suggestions**Best time to visit:**

From mid-June through October, subject to the opening of the facilities, the absence of snow, and trail conditions.

For the 2026 season, the Percorso della Purezza is tentatively scheduled to open in mid-August, once the installation of signage and information boards is complete.

The trail is particularly recommended during the summer months and on the hottest days, thanks to its elevation and the presence of long shaded stretches.

Before setting out, always check:

whether the trail is actually open;

the lift schedules;

the time of the last downhill run;

weather conditions;

any temporary restrictions due to construction or maintenance.

Roadbook

From the ski lift stations at Bormio 2000, head toward the start of the Strada dell'Acqua (toward Santa Caterina – Monti di Sobretta), following the signs for the Percorso della Purezza.

The trail continues through the woods along an easy-to-walk dirt road. As you ascend, you'll gradually come across informational displays and art installations dedicated to water, nature, and the Alpine environment.

The route alternates between short flat stretches and moderate inclines, always staying on the main trail.

Once you reach the end of the route, where a marvelous view of the glaciers opens up, the return trip follows the same path as the

outbound

journey back to Bormio 2000.

The total length of approximately 4 kilometers therefore includes both the outbound and return legs.

How to get there

Public transport

Bormio can be reached by scheduled bus services from Tirano and other towns in the area.

From the town center, you can reach the ski lift departure station on foot or by using any local transportation services operating during the summer season.

Please check the schedules before departure.

Directions

From Bormio, head to the ski lift departure station (Via Funivie) and take the lift up to Bormio 2000. From the arrival station, follow the signs for the Percorso della Purezza and the Strada dell'Acqua.

The trail can also be reached via the road to Bormio 2000; however, be sure to check in advance for accessibility, parking availability, and any seasonal restrictions.

Using the ski lifts is still the recommended option, especially for families.

Parking

Parking is available at the ski lift departure station in Bormio.

During peak periods, we recommend arriving early.

Any parking available directly at Bormio 2000 should be checked based on the season and traffic regulations.
